

Public Speaking Guidelines

- Pick a topic of interest to you so that it will be easy and fun for you to present.
- Use your imagination in choosing what to do.
- PETS: If you bring a pet, you MUST have it in a box or crate or in your arms at all times (no animals walking through the church building). If you set your pet on a church table to show during your sharing time, you are responsible to bring some type of disinfectant to spray the table afterwards.
- Each student will have 3-4 minutes for the presentation, allowing approximately 1 minute for Q & A. Practice and time yourself at home.
- Siblings within the same class are welcome to do a joint presentation.
- We encourage props! Posters, scrapbooks, pictures, and anything made by you will enhance your topic.
- Read the “Practical Tips for Effective Public Speaking.”
- Have a great time!
